



## DIAGNOSTIC CRITERIA

# PERIPHERAL SPONDYLOARTHRITIS

### INTRODUCTION:

- Sensitivity: 77.8%
- Specificity: 82.2%

### REFERENCE VALUES:

One of: arthritis, enthesitis or dactylitis, plus at least one of: uveitis, psoriasis, inflammatory bowel disease, HLA B27, sacroiliitis, or at least two remaining of: arthritis, enthesitis, dactylitis, IBP in the past, family history of SpA.

One of the primary criteria is required for classification as Peripheral SpA.

Primary criteria	Secondary criteria	
Arthritis	Uveitis	HLA B27 infection
Enthesis	Psoriasis	Sacroiliitis
Dactylitis	Inflammatory bowel disease	IBP in the past
	Preceding infection	Family history of SpA
